Below are some instructions from the virtual summer programmers on our last discovery day! We are making back-to-school keychains and baking a tie-dye cake to celebrate the end of our summer together and the start of a new school year! 😊

1. Keychains

Materials:

- Shrink paper
- Fine tip markers
- Stencils
- Key chain rings
- Pan
- Oven



Instructions:

- Take a piece of shrink paper and lay it flat on the table.
- You can free hand draw or use a stencil to draw whatever you would like on your shrink paper using fine tip markers or pencil crayons.
- Once you have an outline of what you want to draw, colour in your drawing.
- To make your drawing into a key chain you need to add a loop to your drawing and then a second larger loop.
- In the middle of the loop cut a hole to attach our key chain to.

2. Tie-Dye Cake!


Materials:

- Cake Mix
- Water
- Food Colouring
- Vegetable Oil or Butter
- Eggs (or substitute egg replacer for eggs)

- Measuring Cups
- Spoons
- Bowl
- Frosting

Instructions:

- Use the instructions on the back of your cake batter box to mix the wet and dry ingredients together (if you are using a home-made recipe, that is awesome!)
- Mix the batter thoroughly using a mixer
- Separate the batter into different bowls depending on how many different colours you want
- Add food colouring to the separate bowls. Each bowl should be a different colour. Mix dye in until desired colour is achieved.
- Line the cupcake tray with cupcake liners then pour small portions of the different colour mixtures into the cupcake liners. Layer the colours so they will create a marbling of tie dye colours.
 - o Tip: It is easiest to do this by spooning the coloured cake batter into the liners.
- Bake according to cooking time of recipe being used.
- Spoon white frosting into separate bowls and add food colouring to each. Mix the food dye into the frosting until desired colour is achieved.
- Take cupcakes out of the oven and give them time to cool. Once the cupcakes are cool you can frost them. You can do this by using a knife or spooning the frosting into zip-lock bags. Cut a small hole out of the tip of the zip-lock bag and squeeze icing onto the cupcake in a circular motion
