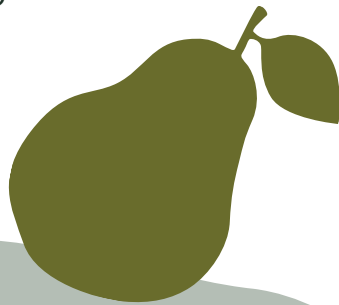

Seed Library

What is a Seed Library

A seed library is just what it sounds like: a library of different seeds that amateur and experienced gardeners alike can “borrow” to take home, grow and enjoy. At the end of the growing season, participants are asked to save some seeds from their plants and donate them to the library for others to grow.

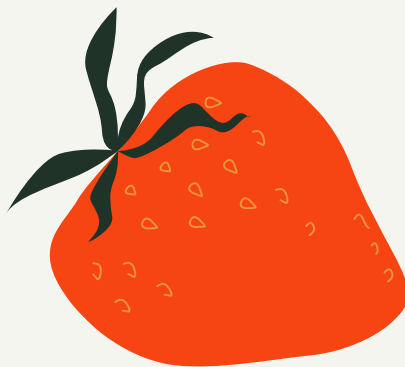

How to "Borrow" Seeds

"Borrowing" seeds is as easy as borrowing a book;

1. Browse the seed collections at the Jarvis or Dunnville Branch.
2. Select the seeds you wish to "borrow".
3. Take them home, plant them and enjoy!

How to Donate Seeds

To sustain our seed library and expand our collection, HCPL is asking for your donations of flower and vegetable seeds.
