



Civil Marriage Ceremony – Option #2

THE PURPOSE

OFFICIANT:

On behalf of _____ and _____, welcome and thank you for being here on this special day. By your presence, you celebrate with them the love they have discovered in each other and you support their decision to commit themselves to one another for the rest of their lives. Today we are here to celebrate love. We come together to witness and proclaim the joining together of these two people.

Marriage is not to be entered upon thoughtlessly or irresponsibly but with a due and serious understanding and appreciation of the ends for which it is contracted.

Therefore, if there is any one present who can show just cause why these two persons may not be lawfully joined together in matrimony, they should now declare it or hereafter remain silent.

I do solemnly declare that I do not know of any lawful impediment why I _____ may not be joined in matrimony to _____.

DECLARATION OF INTENT AND VOWS

OFFICIANT (To each participant in turn):

Would you please face each other and join hands.

Please repeat after me:

I call upon these persons here present, to witness that I _____ do take you _____ to be my Lawful wedded (wife/husband/spouse/partner) to have and to hold, from this day forward. For better, for worse, for richer for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, so long as we both shall live.

EXCHANGE OF RINGS

**The exchange of rings is optional in any ceremony.*

OFFICIANT (To each participant in turn):

This ring is a symbol of your marriage and a symbol of your love and life together.

Please place the ring on _____'s finger, hold it there and say these words to him/her/them:

I give you this ring as a token of my love and devotion to you. I pledge to you all that I am and all that I will ever be as your (husband/wife/spouse/partner). With this ring, I gladly marry you and join my life with yours.

PRONOUNCEMENT

OFFICIANT:
